- 1st reference comes in the Christchurch Inclosure Award 1805, in which a 'Charminster Lane' is cited.
- 1841 census shows 3 families living there a Tinker, a Bricklayer and Watton the Farm Labourer.
- The first modern dwellings in Charminster were built ground 1880.
- A fresh spate of housebuilding took place north of Alma Road and Richmond Park Road in the 1920s.
- Charminster Library, designed by F. P. Dolamore, was opened in 1932.
- When Bournemouth Council built the early council houses in Luckham Road they came up with the concepts of an "upper" and "lower" Charminster.
- Now the area is a hustling bustling community with many local eateries and shops dotted along the busy high street, the area connecting Bournemouth/Cemetry Junction to CastlePoint and Winton

Christian Bale lived in Capstone Road from 1985 to 1991.

Zoologist & writer Gerald Durrell lived at St Albans Avenue for a time.

Comedian Tony Hancock lived at 2 homes just outside Charminster and Queens Park. The first tram ran from Richmond Hill, Bournemouth to Capstone Road from Christmas 1902.



In February 1942 there were 5 Air Raid Shelters locally, designed to hold a combined total of 767 people. One of them was based at local park Winton Recreational Ground or 'Winton Rec' for short.



Did you know... There is another Charminster near Dorchester. It is a small village on the River Cerne.
